Ras Al Khaimah Art 2027 Festival

Ras Al Khaimah Art provides an immersive and sensory cultural experience to local and international visitors. Ras Al Khaimah Art blends the modern and the ancient, bringing together a variety of artforms whilst encouraging dialogue between artists, authors, creatives and the community at Al Jazeera Al Hamra Heritage Village.

Ras Al Khaimah Art 2027 Festival is curated by Sharon Toval and organized by the Sheikh Saud bin Saqr Al Qasimi Foundation for Policy Research under the Ras Al Khaimah Art Program.

Titled **Lost in Translation**, Ras Al Khaimah Art 2027 Festival is inspired by Sofia Coppola's iconic film (2003) and takes "translation" as a central idea and metaphor.

It is not only about language but also about emotions, culture, and the experience of being in a place where you do not fully belong. It is about the distance between people, quiet loneliness, and the deep human desire to transform and connect even when understanding seems incomplete.

Sharon brings together more than 140 artworks by over 130 artists from 54 nationalities who reflect on migration, memory, belonging, and the tension between personal identity and public role. They also explore how meaning shifts when it moves from one context to another, or how places and landscapes can create connection or isolation.

Al Jazeera Al Hamra Heritage Village is the United Arab Emirates' last remaining intact Emirati pearling village. It provides a deep connection to the legacy of the pearl diving history and cultural heritage of the United Arab Emirates. The village includes traditional elements including a fort and watchtowers, mosque, souq and courtyard houses of various designs. Today, Al Jazeera Al Hamra Heritage Village serves as a place to preserve, protect, and share the rich cultural heritage, ensuring that future generations can experience and learn from this 16th-century pearl fishing village.

Accessibility

Al Jazeera Al Hamra Heritage Village is a historic site with some uneven, sandy and narrow pathways. Information about accessible routes, parking and drop-off points, wheelchair provision, companion access and other visitor support will be published closer to the Festival. 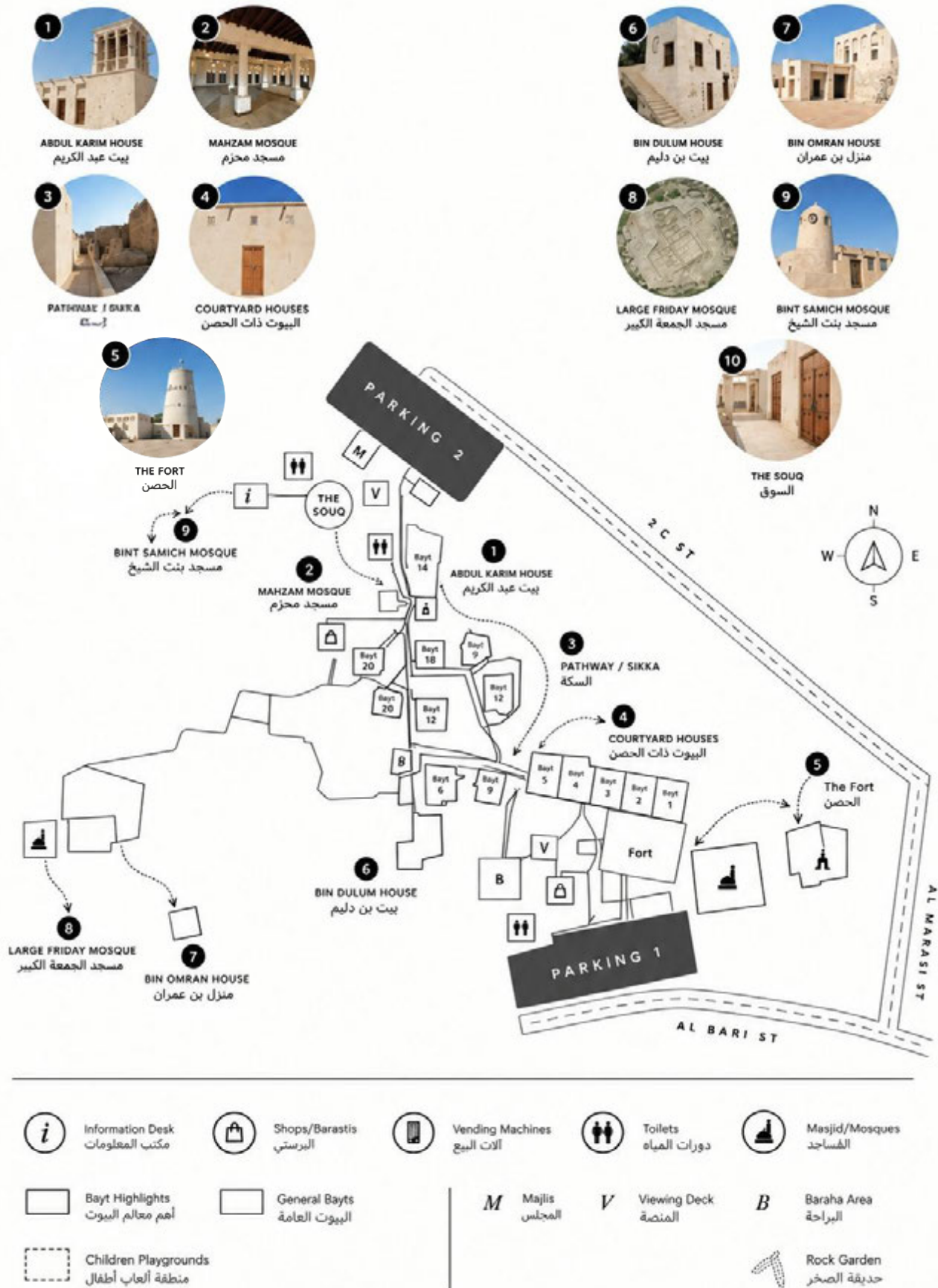
Heritage site guidance

Program Highlights

Ras Al Khaimah Art 2027 Festival brings together exhibitions, tours, workshops, masterclasses, performances, cultural activities and dining experiences.

Among program highlights is **The Whispers Palace**, offering an innovative way to experience video art, somewhere between a traditional Bedouin camp and a surreal, post-human environment. Inspired by Emirati and Bedouin tent structures, it invites visitors to gather in intimate spaces and encounter moving-image works together. Within Lost in Translation, the installation becomes a space between worlds: tradition and future, memory and imagination, physical gathering and mediated experience.

For the first time in a contemporary art festival, **InstArtWorld** presents Instagram accounts as works of digital art in their own right. Pre-selected posts by their creators transform each account into a curated visual universe of videos, GIFs, animations, and experimental imagery. These artists dedicate their creative practices to the online world, some working with AI and digital technologies, others incorporating handmade materials from the physical world. Here, scrolling becomes an exhibition experience, questioning where art is created, displayed, and encountered.

Lastly, **The Hidden Table** is where gastronomy and art meet in a reimagined dining experience at the Ras Al Khaimah Art Festival. From the Flamingo Room by tashas where African Glamour comes to life, and the Michelin-starred artistry of Newcastle's Restaurant Pine, each evening unveils a distinct culinary narrative within the historic walls of Al Jazeera Al Hamra.

RAK Art on the Move

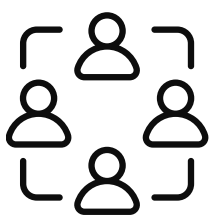
RAK Art on the Move extends Ras Al Khaimah Art Festival beyond the emirate through a series of curated spaces. Each edition presents selected artworks alongside live performances, talks and creative experiences, introducing artists to new audiences and creating opportunities for exchange and collaboration.

To begin, the Dubai edition will take place from 24 to 25 October 2026 at Progressive Art Gallery, followed by the Sharjah edition from 5 to 6 December 2026 at Base39, Sharjah Research, Technology and Innovation Park. The program will bring together artists, curators, collectors, cultural institutions, gallery representatives, creative professionals, media, diplomats and private sector stakeholders.

Further editions are planned internationally, extending RAK Art on the Move to connect with wider communities and build new relationships beyond the United Arab Emirates.

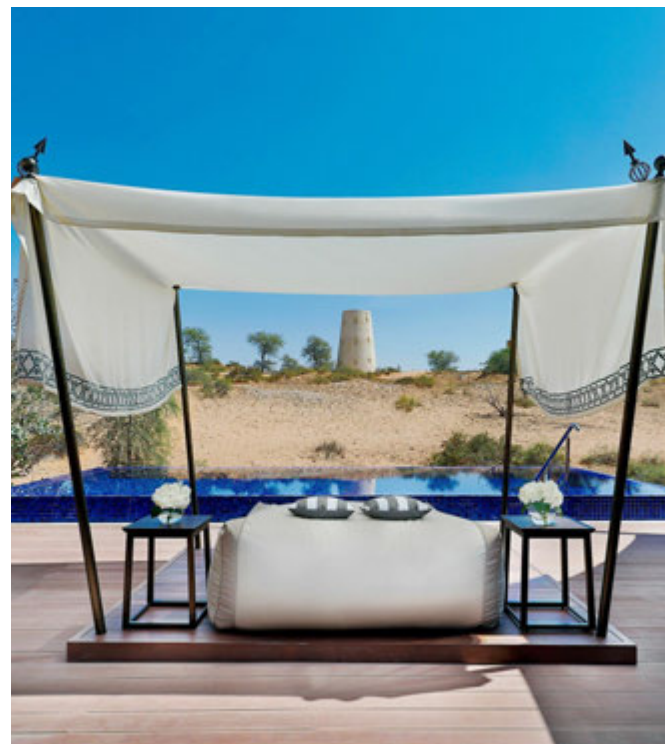

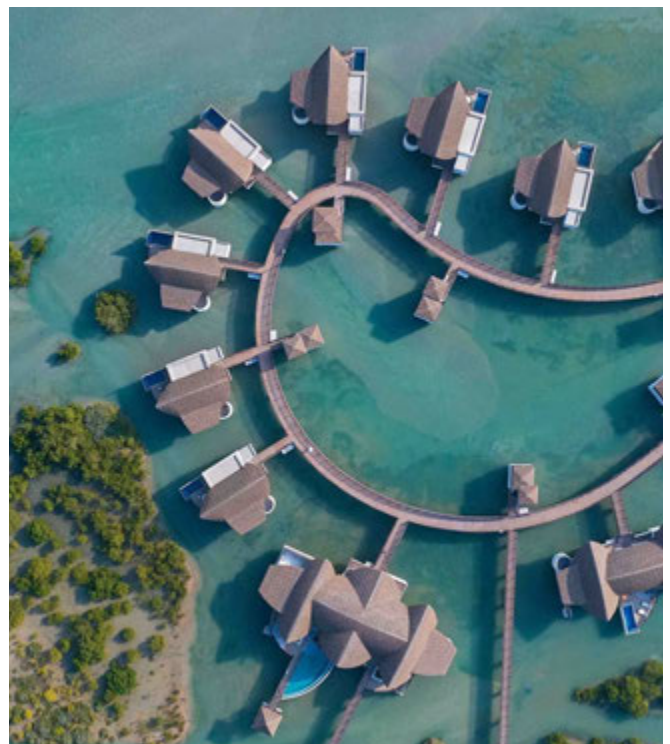

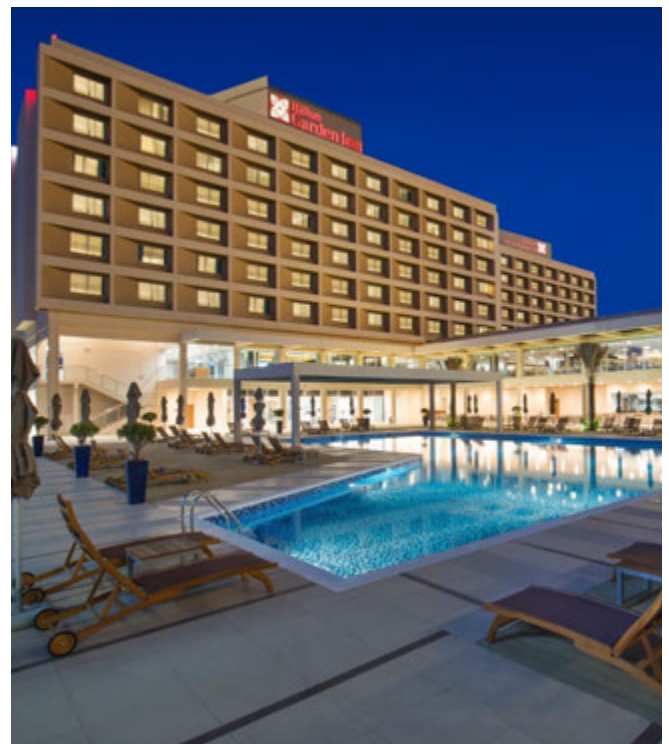

Travel Essentials



Passport & Visa

Please check the entry requirements through the official UAE Government portal before traveling. Passports generally require at least six months' validity from the date of entry.



Currency

The local currency is the UAE dirham (AED), pegged to US Dollar at AED 3.67. Credit and debit cards are accepted, although a small amount of cash can be useful.



Climate

Ras Al Khaimah is generally mild in January and February, with daytime temperatures of around 24– 25°C and cooler evenings of approximately 13– 14°C. Occasional rain is possible.



What to wear

Light, modest clothing is recommended, along with a jacket or shawl for cooler evenings. Comfortable footwear is essential for exploring the heritage village's natural and uneven surfaces.



During Ramadan

Festival hours and hospitality arrangements may change during Ramadan. Visitors are encouraged to respect local customs around fasting, prayer and shared public spaces, and to check the Festival program before visiting.



Time zone

Gulf Standard Time (UTC/GMT +4). The UAE does not observe daylight-saving time.



Electricity

The UAE uses a 220–240 V, 50 Hz electricity supply. Type G plugs are standard, so some travelers may require an adaptor.



Mobile connectivity

e&, du and Virgin Mobile operate across the UAE. Tourist SIM cards and eSIM packages are available.
